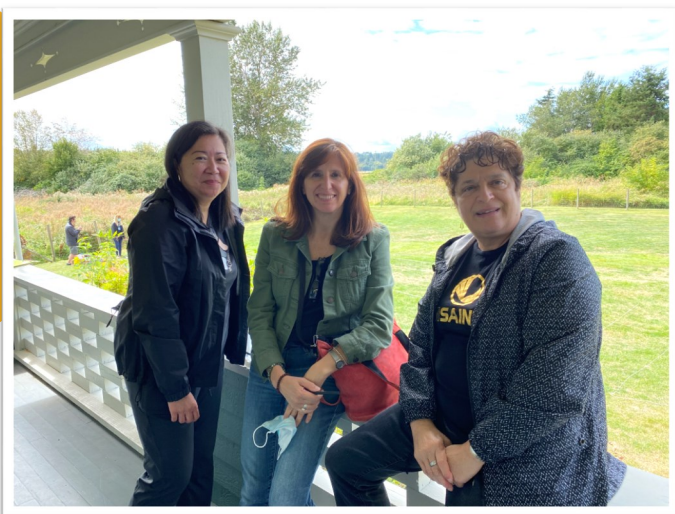

Introducing: Amberlina DeGraaf, Kristina Prtenjaca, Juri Matsuda, Keith Kavlekar and Joya Bevacqua

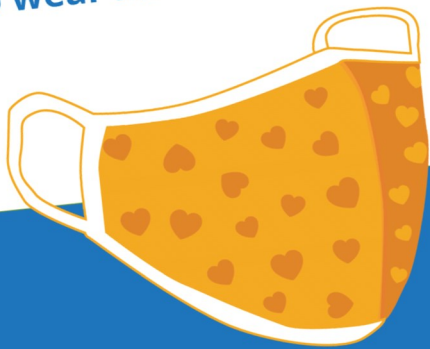

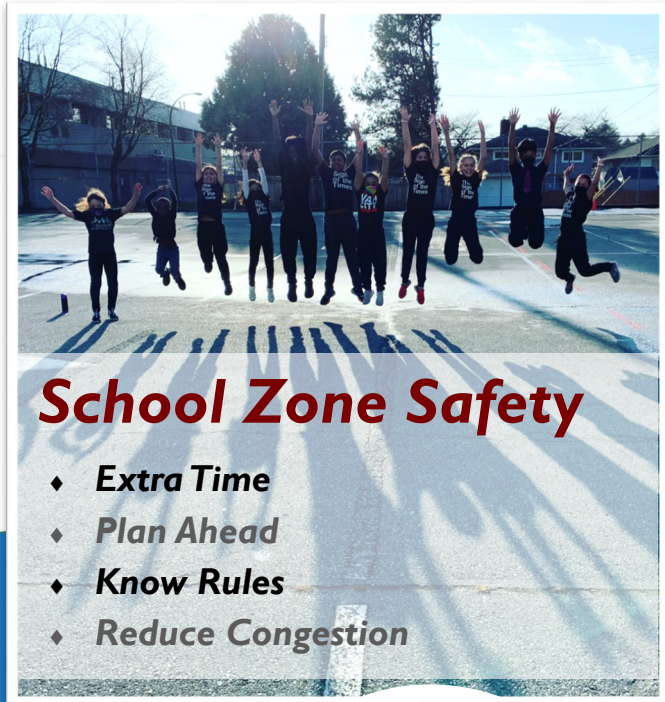
Saints' Health & Safety

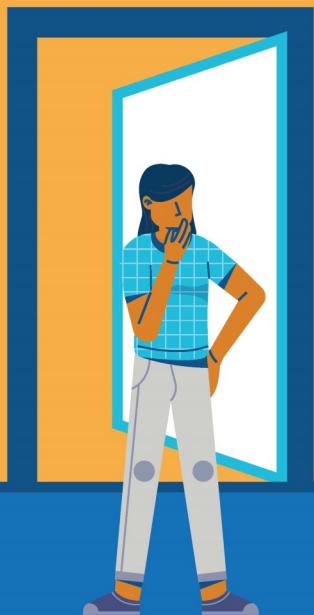

UNIFORM:

- ◆ Students can wear a combination of these items according to the weather or activities
- ◆ Kindergarten girls wear shorts under dresses on PE days
- ◆ Running shoes which fit properly and provide support for rigorous physical activity
- ◆ Long hair to be tied back
- ◆ No jewelry, including necklaces, bracelets, rings, dangling earrings, etc.
